A Note from the General Manager

After a challenging but successful 2021 summer, we are looking forward to welcoming guests in 2022 and celebrating RDC's 125th anniversary. Our success and reason to celebrate would not be possible without the love and support of our RDC family. Thanks to our board of directors for their ongoing support and strategic guidance as we navigate our second season of operations with COVID-19 still present in our daily lives.

Our goal remains to provide a safe environment for all our guests and staff while returning to some traditions that guests look forward to each year. We will continue to follow federal, state, and local health guidelines in addition to the recommendations from our board of directors as we develop our plans and safety protocols for the 2022 season.

We will begin booking reservations on February 15 and, at this time, our season will run from June 1 through September 5, Labor Day weekend. We are actively searching for additional employees to join our team to extend guest reservations and our groups and conference season through September 18. If you or someone you know would like to lend us a hand, please check the staffing page at the end of this newsletter. Keeping safety at the forefront of our 2022 season, we have also decided again to rent Greenwood Lodge and Long House in their entirety. See 2022 Rates.

Both Rockywold and Deephaven Dining Halls will be open, offering traditional seating with an extended two-hour serving time for each meal. In addition, take-out containers will be available for those wishing to enjoy their meals outside the dining hall.

We will offer full daily housekeeping and outside crew services. If you prefer a lower-contact experience and would like to opt out of any portion of these services, you may notify our office staff at any time.

Our Wee Camper program for 3-5-year-olds will also return and be available Monday-Friday mornings.






Forever Fund

RDC Charitable Giving

The Squam Environmental Preservation Fund (SEPF) was created in 1997 to honor RDC's Centennial and to offer a way for our community to make tax-deductible gifts that support the long-term conservation of the lake we all love.

RDC's Board of Directors makes annual grants from the SEPF to initiatives of conservation organizations working in the Squam region that sustain the natural beauty and ecological health of the Squam Lakes and their watersheds. Since the creation of this fund, the SEPF has awarded 32 grants totaling \$192,500. In 2021 the SEPF awarded two grants. A \$10,000 grant was awarded to the Loon Preservation Committee to help continue its long-term research

focused on the health of loons nesting on Squam Lake. For more information on this important research go to the LPC website at www. loon.org/squam-lake-study.php. A second grant of \$6,000 was made to the NH Audubon to help build their larger MOTUS regional tracking network that can track individual birds, butterflies, and bats as they migrate. The SEPF grant was to install one MOTUS telemetry tracking station in the Squam watershed, which is one of 50 in New England and one of 900 in the MOTUS global network. The SEPF fund is managed for RDC by the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation as a donor-designated fund. A history of awarded SEPF grants is posted on our website at rdcsquam.com/sepf-history.html. RDC generally contributes 5% of our Store and Zodiac revenue to the SEPF fund.

2021 Bald Eagle Report

The Squam Lake Bald Eagle pair had a tough start to 2021. The nest they used on Loon Island in 2020 completely fell apart by the end of that breeding season, so they had to start from scratch. We also had a new female in the pair. In the fall of 2020, our old female (twenty-one years old) was found dead on an island on Lake Wickwas. Her injuries suggested she died from wounds she received in a fight with another female. The day after she died, I saw a new (victorious) female sitting with the male on their favorite perch tree on Long Island. In the eagle world, there is no sentimentality. No doubt a young female decided to challenge our old girl, and the male let them get on with it. He was waiting on the perch tree for whoever won. The pair didn't do any nest building in the fall (which many do), so when the 2021 breeding season rolled around, they had a lot to do. The male was determined to build on the same tree and brought stick after stick to the white pine. His attempts were blown down by the strong late-winter winds time and time again. Mid-March came and went, and still no sign of incubation. Finally, by early April, they had a good-sized nest constructed, and the pair were still mating, but no eggs were laid. They just took too long to get their act together. The pair remained around the lake and the nest stayed together, so hopefully they have a better base to start with in 2022.

Building Committee Report

Good progress has been made on the significant, multi-year septic project. Part one of the construction work—installing a new underground collection and pre-treatment tanks outside of each dining hall—was completed in the spring of 2021 before Camp opened for the season. Part two began right after Camp closed this fall: The existing lagoon treatment system and adjacent recharge basin were drained, and new septic tanks were placed in the empty lagoon pit. These buried treatment tanks will pump the effluent to a new underground dispersal field, beneath newly rebuilt outer courts, for the third and final step in the wastewater treatment process. Work will continue in the new year as soon as weather conditions permit and will be substantially completed before Camp opens for the 2022 season. Project completion and close-out tasks will happen in the fall of 2022. The project is on schedule, and its upcoming completion in 2022 will ensure compliance with state regulatory requirements for the foreseeable future.

Other capital projects in 2022 are quite limited and include: food service infrastructure improvements at the ball field supporting its continued use as a satellite dining location, roof repairs on a couple of buildings, and new entrance doors at the Deephaven Dining Hall.

We all depend on and benefit from the year-to-year capital improvements at RDC, including the less glamorous ones like septic upgrades. Many people work hard to make these projects happen, especially Camp's longtime design professional, David Driscoll, and General Manager Kathy Wheeler, who led those efforts. Thank you Dave, Kathy, and the team!

2021 Loon Report

It was a challenging year for Squam's loons, a year filled with a mix of encouraging and disappointing news for the lake's loon population. In encouraging news, the lake gained a new pair of loons, bringing the population to 14 pairs. Ten of those pairs nested—a good rate of nesting—and hatched eight chicks. This rate of chicks hatched is quite a bit higher than the average of recent years, so that was an encouraging number as well.

With eight chicks hatched, I hoped a good number of chicks would fledge. Unfortunately,

only three of those chicks survived to fledge at the end of summer. This resulted in a chick survival rate that was similar to the average of recent years. Overall, the average rate of breeding success on Squam from 2008-2021 remains less than half the statewide average.

Adult loons struggled as well in 2021, as Squam's loon population suffered the loss of two of its long-time banded adult loons. One adult died for reasons that are unclear. A second adult died from avian malaria. This is now the second Squam loon in the last three years to have died of this emerging disease in loons, one that is likely linked to a changing climate.

The challenges facing Squam's loons as a whole were shared by the loon pair around RDC. Happily, the same pair as last year returned to the waters of RDC, including the old female—now at least ~29 years old! The pair nested, but, sadly, their egg did not hatch. A week after the expected hatch date, when it was clear the egg would not be successful, the egg ended up in the water and the pair abandoned the nest. Working under state and federal permits, I collected the egg for the Loon Preservation Committee's (LPC) research.

LPC tested the RDC female's inviable egg from the 2020 breeding season for contaminants, and the results were concerning. We have a remarkable time series of contaminant data for this female, with her inviable eggs from 1998, 2010, and 2020 all tested. Unfortunately, her contaminant levels have increased across all chemical classes for which we test, with the exception of PFAS (stain repellants, etc.). Her levels of PCBs, flame retardants, and chlordane (a pesticide) all either doubled or nearly doubled since 2010. Her levels of DDE (a breakdown product of DDT) and dioxins/furans (industrial byproducts) increased substantially as well. LPC will continue to research these contaminants in Squam's loons and their potential effects on the loon population. LPC will continue working to understand and reverse the declines in Squam's loon population. As we work to restore a healthy population of loons to Squam Lake, we are very grateful to the RDC community and the Squam Environmental Preservation Fund for your support of Squam's loons and the work of LPC—Thank You! All best wishes to the RDC community!

RDC Boathouse Update

Boats and related equipment are in very high demand, and we have placed orders for new boats and equipment early, hoping to

receive them in time for the guest season. Our stand up paddleboards (SUPs) are made by SIC and the model is the Tao Surf, which is a great blend of durability and performance. This is the same board with new graphics as the Bic Sports Performer, which has been in the rental fleet since 2019.

We are continuing to phase out the Ocean Kayak Nalu 12.5 sit-on-top kayaks and are replacing them with Ocean Kayak Malibu 11.5, which is more of a sit-on-top kayak and less of a hybrid SUP. The pedal kayaks continue to grow in popularity because they are very well designed and comfortable for more extended tours of the lake. Of course, we still have plenty of recreational, touring, and double kayaks as well as canoes, rowboats, Hydrobikes, and Sunfish sailboats.

Our Dress Code Has Relaxed, But We Still Have One!



2022 Reservation Requests

Our reservation team of Alana, Becky, and Lucy are looking forward to welcoming vou back to RDC for the 2022 season.

We will be able to serve you more efficiently if your form is filled out completely and clearly. Newspapers must be ordered at least seven days prior to your arrival; golf cart rentals are available only for guests with mobility issues; weekly boat rentals may be reserved prior to your arrival; and daily rentals may be requested upon your arrival.

To request a reservation, please complete the enclosed Reservation Request Form or go online to RDCsquam.com/reservations. Reservations are booked according to seniority, and to give yourself the best opportunity to receive the cottages and dates of your choice your request must be received before **FEBRUARY 15.**

You will find all of our 2022 materials at RDCsquam.com, including floor plans for all our cottages and lodges. Please give us a call if you have any questions.

2022 Reservation Information

We are working towards transitioning back to a "normal" RDC season, keeping a safe environment for our guests and team members as our top priority. While we plan to welcome you back with the usual hospitality, we will still monitor the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation closely and make necessary adjustments as needed.

At this time, our regular guest season will begin Saturday, June 11, and end Monday, September 5.

The following are other adjustments and reminders for our 2022 season.

Cottage Point Person

We will be asking for a point person from each cottage. This will be used for communicating information to guest families and contact tracing if needed. Please indicate your point person on your Reservation Request Form.

Arrival and Departure times

Arriving guests should not enter their accommodations before registering at the office.

Check-in is after 5 p.m.

Check-out is no later than 10 a.m.

Dining

Both Rockywold and Deephaven dining halls will be open, offering traditional seating with a two-hour serving time for each meal. In addition, take-out containers will be available for those wishing to enjoy their meals outside the dining hall. We encourage anyone of high risk to arrive during the beginning of each meal hour where there may be less traffic.

Daily Visitors

For the health and safety of our RDC community, we strongly discourage daily visitors to Camp for the summer of 2022. A daily visitor is anyone outside the family unit assigned to a cottage or accommodation. Our regular guests have been asked to comply with RDC's health and safety guidelines before their arrival, and daily visitors would put both our guests and staff at risk. We appreciate your cooperation.

Lodges to be Reserved by the Week Again in 2022

As we plan for the upcoming season, we are continuing to keep safety at the forefront of our decision-making. We will again rent both Greenwood Lodge and Long House, in their entirety, at a weekly 12-person rate of \$16,000 per week. Greenwood Lodge can sleep a maximum of 20 guests, and Long House sleeps a maximum of 24. Regular overage rates will apply. Reservation requests for the lodges will be filled through the usual reservation process.

At this time, the Rock Office Rooms will not be offered as guest accommodations.







2022 RATES

All cottages enjoy a private dock on Squam Lake, a fireplace, a screened-in porch, and an old-fashioned icebox. Our Full American Plan includes lodging, all meals, daily housekeeping, organized activities, and use of recreational facilities, including eight clay tennis courts, three pickleball courts, a basketball court, and a ball field. Reservations are made on a weekly basis for cottages and lodges. There are no additional service charges. Gratuities are not required, but guests are welcome to reward employees for exceptional service.

OVERAGES

Most cottages accommodate guests beyond the minimal occupancy; such persons are charged the "Weekly Overage Rate" of \$1,136 or a "Daily Overage Rate" of \$162 per night. Overage Rates will include three meals per day and organized activities. The Overage Rate for children ages 2-8 is 50% off the above Overage Rate. There is no overage charge for children under 2 years of age.

LODGES (June 20 - September 3)

Keeping safety at the forefront of our 2022 season, we have decided to rent Greenwood Lodge and Long House in their entirety. The weekly rate covers our Full American Plan and overages apply as described above.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Arrival and Departure times: Check-in time is after 5 p.m., and check-out time is no later than 10 a.m. To ensure your accommodation has been properly cleaned, sanitized, and inspected, arriving guests should not enter their lodging facility before registering at the office. Mid-day meals on departure and arrival days are not included in weekly rates. Bagged lunches are available to guests who give the dining room a day's notice before departure.
- A 20% deposit, received within 30 days from the date of our offer letter, is required to confirm a reservation.
- Cancellation Policy: If a cancellation is made prior to May 15, 50% of the deposit will be refunded. Reservations canceled after May 15 and prior to a month of expected arrival will lose the full 20% deposit. Reservations canceled within one month of expected arrival will be responsible for 50% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled. Reservations canceled within two weeks of expected arrival will be responsible for 100% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled.
- New Hampshire Rooms and Meals Tax of 8.5% is added to lodging and meal charges.
- **Gratuities:** Unlike many other resorts, RDC does not add a service charge to guest bills; however, guests may wish to reward employees for exceptional service. Gratuity envelopes are available in both offices.
- RDC's Recreation Programs, with activities for all ages, will begin June 12 and end September 2.
- **A morning playgroup**, called Wee Campers, is provided from June 13 to September 2 for children 3 to 6 years of age, Monday Friday, 9:30 a.m. 12 noon. (Refer to RDC's Guest Manual for details.)



RDC's Reservation Process:

We frequently receive multiple requests for the same accommodations in the same time periods, especially in July and August. Potential conflicts are resolved on the basis of priority and seniority (defined below).

In order to receive early consideration for an accommodation, we must receive a written request prior to **February 15**. Requests received after **February 15** will be honored but only after filling all those received before the deadline. Typically, availability becomes quite limited as the summer approaches. We ask that all guests use the Reservation Request Form on the reverse side of this paper.

When reservation bookings begin on **February 15**, the order in which reservations are placed is as follows:

- 1) All "priority" guests.
- 2) Guests with the most "seniority credit" to guests with the least seniority credit.

(Additional credit is given to guests staying for two or more consecutive weeks in the same accommodation.)

Priority:

Guests who have reserved the same accommodation during the same time period for three consecutive years earn what is called a priority. A guest having priority on a particular accommodation will be given the first option to reserve that accommodation for the appropriate time period.

Seniority Credit:

Guests receive one seniority credit for each year in which they were guests in camp for one week or longer after the age of 25. This credit applies whether or not the individual has paid an RDC bill. No credit is given for partial-week stays. An additional credit is granted to guests who stayed at RDC prior to age 25, current RDC shareholders receive one additional credit, and a further credit is granted to those guests who served as an employee for at least one full season. A maximum of one seniority credit per season is allowed for any individual.

- If the accommodation requested is available, an offer letter will be sent to you with a request for a 20% deposit. If we receive your deposit within 30 days from the date of the offer letter your reservation is confirmed.
- If the accommodation requested is not available, a staff member will attempt to contact you to discuss alternatives. Please make sure we can reach you in **February and early March** by giving us current work and home phone numbers, e-mail addresses and an alternative contact person should you be away!
- If the accommodation requested is not available, and no alternatives exist, you will be notified and put on a waiting list if you wish.

Cancellation Policy:

- If a cancellation is made prior to May 15, 50% of the deposit will be refunded.
- Reservations canceled after May 15 and prior to a month of expected arrival will lose the full 20% deposit.
- Reservations canceled within one month of expected arrival will be responsible for 50% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled.
- Reservations canceled within two weeks of expected arrival will be responsible for 100% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled.



FACILITY INFORMATION - RDC has multiple meeting/function facilities:

The Rockywold and Deephaven Dining Rooms can be used for a wide variety of activities and events. Both the Rockywold and Deephaven Dining Rooms can comfortably seat 250 people.

The Playhouse is a pavilion with a raised stage, suitable for entertainment, exhibits and dances. The Playhouse is adjacent to the Ball Field.

The Ball Field and Pavilion are available for outdoor gatherings including field games, special picnics, and barbecues.

The Long House is a lodge situated on the Deephaven point providing spectacular views of the Squam Mountain Range and Red Hill. It has a common area that can accommodate up to 100 people theater seating, 75 people for receptions and 60 people for banquets.

Greenwood Lodge is located on the Rockywold side of Camp and provides views of the lake and its islands. The common area can accommodate 45 people theater seating and 60 people for receptions (using porches).

Deephaven Conference Room is adjacent to the Deephaven Office. The room can accommodate 25 people in a classroom or 40 theater setting.

RDC's larger cottages can also be used as small meeting facilities.

Kellogg (Rec Hall) is connected to the Playhouse and located in the center of Camp. The room is equipped with a large TV, AC/heat and can accommodate up to 25 people.

The Commons is located in the center of Camp and in close proximity to the Playhouse. Within The Commons is a meeting room that opens to a large screened in-porch. It is equipped with a 75" screen TV, sound system, AC/heat and can accommodate 30-50 people.




