A Note from the General Manager

Welcome to the 2023 *Barque & Bight*! The RDC team is excited to report on many aspects of Camp operations from this past season. Most importantly, we look forward to welcoming you back to Camp in the summer of 2023.

As I reflect on my first season at RDC, I am incredibly touched by the sense of community I have witnessed throughout the year. The genuine enthusiasm and appreciation of our guest community as they returned to Camp has filled us with even more determination to deliver to you a memorable visit while carrying on the time-honored traditions of RDC.

The team is very proud to have restored the Camp to full operation. We successfully transitioned to new management, outsourced our accounting and payroll procedures, and brought the entire food service operation in-house allowing us to source locally. Our staffing levels were adequate with employees coming to us from 10 countries, and we managed through the COVID pandemic with minimal interruption to our operations. The season was not without challenge which was to be expected. The increased COVID protocols required additional expense and time. Supply chain issues were a significant factor for the food program, the Camp Store, and Zodiac. Throughout the summer, our emergency response system was tested, highlighting an area in need of improvement.

As we prepare for the 2023 season, we will build on the momentum of this past season and focus on the areas of opportunity.

In October, Fire Chief Bonan and the New Hampshire 911 service team electronically and physically mapped every building on Camp and have updated the 911 map to ensure that all first responders will be able to locate every building during an emergency. Further, Chief Bonan and I have committed to shared training in the spring for his volunteer firefighters and our crew members.

In the dining halls, we will offer more gluten-free, nut-free, dairy-free, and sugar-free items. We intend to bring back the omelet and stir-fry stations if staffing levels permit, and we will expand the kid's menu to include more healthy options. We will continue with the 90-minute meal period as the guest feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. Also, we felt the additional time provided a gracious, uncrowded dining experience for all.

Daily housekeeping and outside crew services will continue in 2023. If you would prefer a low-contact experience and would like to opt out of any portion of these services, you may notify our staff at any time. Check-out time remains 10:00 a.m., however, we have returned to a 4:00 p.m. check-in time.

We strongly recommend that all of our guests obtain the COVID vaccine and appropriate boosters. We continue to request that all guests have a negative test before coming to Camp. We will communicate any updates to our COVID policies via email and on our website.


In closing, I am sincerely grateful for the very warm welcome and the successful 2022 season. I look forward to many more seasons to come!

RDC Charitable Giving

The Squam Environmental Preservation Fund (SEPF) was created in 1997 to honor RDC's Centennial and to offer a way for our community to make tax-deductible gifts that support the long-term conservation of the lake and watershed we all love.

RDC's Board of Directors makes annual grants from the SEPF to initiatives of conservation organizations working in the Squam region that sustain the natural beauty and ecological health of the Squam Lakes and their watersheds. Since the creation of this fund, the SEPF has awarded 35 grants totaling \$217,500. In 2022 the SEPF awarded three grants. A \$10,000 grant was awarded to the Loon Preservation Committee to help continue its long-term research focus on the health of loons nesting on Squam Lake. A second grant of \$10,000 was made to the Squam Lakes Association funding the Student Conservation Association crew that expertly stabilized severely eroded areas on the Old Bridle Path near the top of Rattlesnake Mountain. The third grant of \$5,000 went to the Squam Lakes Natural Science Center to support a solar power project aiming to offset much of the science center's electric needs.

The SEPF fund is managed for RDC by the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation as a donor-designated fund. A history of awarded SEPF grants is posted on our website at www.RDCsquam.com/sepf-history.html. RDC annually contributes 5% of our Store and Zodiac revenue to the SEPF fund.

To the members of the RDC community who have donated more than \$24,070 to the SEPF over the past year, we thank you. Donors have contributed a total of \$382,058 since the fund was created in 1997. Building Committee Report

Major Septic Project Update

After three years of planning, design, and construction, the major lagoon replacement project is substantially complete! As of the start of the 2022 season, the dining halls, housekeeping, and part of the main laundry all send their wastewater to new treatment tanks buried in the old lagoon pit, and from there to a new dispersal field under the newly rebuilt (and very attractive) Outer Courts. This system should serve Camp well for many years. Many thanks go out to the entire team that realized this project, including project leader David Driscoll, Kathy Wheeler, Natalie Ward, Dave LaCasse and the RDC Maintenance Staff, and the New Hampshire-based team of engineers and contractors.

Other Capital Projects

While smaller septic upgrades will continue to take place in the coming years, the Building Committee and Camp management are beginning to focus again primarily on buildings and grounds. In particular, we are conducting a study of our main mixed-use facilities, including the dining halls and lodges, to evaluate structural systems, weatherproofing, egress and fire protection, and accessibility. As in typical years, miscellaneous improvements will also be undertaken at various buildings around Camp, generally addressing roofing, bathrooms, foodservice equipment, and the like.



A New Early-Season Partnership

In early June, RDC will host an eight-day student design-and-build program called Design Assembly. Started in 2012, the annual workshop brings together a team of a dozen college students from around the country, two architects, and a builder to design and build a small project for a rural community. Previous Design Assemblies have operated on islands in Penobscot Bay, Maine, and in the Green Mountains of Vermont; 2023 will bring Design Assembly to Squam Lake for the first time, but hopefully not the last! The community-oriented, handson learning program fits nicely with RDC's long history of providing opportunities for growth and discovery to college-age students. 2022 Loon Report

2022 was filled with both successes and disappointments for Squam's loons. Squam had the same number of loon pairs as last year—fourteen—but, while a pair did not form in one long-standing territory, Squam gained a pair in a territory that has not had a pair since 2004. This "new" territory abuts the territory of the RDC loon pair, who spent much of early summer checking out the new neighbors and making sure they knew where the "property line" was! I hope this new pair will continue in coming years and eventually begin to nest.

Eight loon pairs nested in 2022—a slightly lower number than the last several years, but this was not unexpected given some changes in several pairs this year. Loons often do not nest the first year or two when there is a new pair member. Those eight pairs hatched seven chicks, a good hatch rate which continued the recent five-year trend of an improving hatch rate on Squam—very good news! Unfortunately, only three of those seven chicks fledged from the lake in fall, resulting in a low rate of overall breeding success. In the years since 2008, the average rate of breeding success on Squam is less than half the statewide average.

The Loon Preservation Committee (LPC) floated nine nesting rafts for Squam's loons again this year, and five of the seven chicks hatched on the lake came from these rafts. We placed protective signs and ropes around loon nests, and all chicks were protected by LPC's orange "Caution: Loon Chicks" signs. One of the fledged chicks in 2022 came from a territory that has not hatched a chick in ten years! In addition to the three fledged chicks on Squam Lake, the loon pair on Little Squam pulled off a mid-August hatch and successfully raised a chick as well.

In other good news, no mortalities of adult loons were documented on Squam in 2022. Keeping the adult loons alive and allowing the loon population to stabilize is crucial to the recovery of Squam's loon population and breeding success, so it was very encouraging not to document any adult losses this year.

Both members of the RDC pair were back this year! The male was in the territory for his third year, while RDC's long-standing female turned at least 30 years old this year! The pair settled onto the nest in mid-July; but sadly, two weeks into their four-week incubation, a predator ate the eggs. Hopefully both members of the pair will be back next year and they will try again!

LPC will continue working to understand and reverse the decline in Squam's loon population. As we work to restore a healthy population of loons to Squam Lake, we are very grateful to the RDC community and the Squam Environmental Preservation Fund for your support of Squam's loons and the work of LPC—Thank You! All best wishes to the RDC community!

2022 Bald Eagle Report

The bald eagle pair nested once again on Big Loon Island. One chick hatched and successfully fledged. This is the 26th chick to fledge from this territory since it was first occupied in 2003. Overall, in the Lakes Region, 21 eagle chicks fledged from 12 successful nests, so the population continues to spread locally. On a statewide level, NH Audubon's Chris Martin reports that "In 2022, we confirmed 92 territorial pairs of bald eagles in NH, up nearly 14% compared to 2021. We documented 72 pairs incubating, up more than 7% from 2021. We counted 51 successful nests, which was down 4% compared with the prior year. And we tallied 84 young fledged, up almost 4% over the 81 fledglings produced in both 2019 and in 2021. This year's totals for territorial pairs, pairs incubating, and young fledged all set new state-record highs for the post-DDT era. If the present population growth rate continues for the rest of this decade, NH will have 200 territorial pairs of bald eagles by 2030!"

In 2021, we changed the name of the Recreational Paddleboards to Sit on Top Kayaks, pictured on the front cover. The name change left many of these kayaks on the rack. Guests who rented the newly named Sit on Top Kayaks have enjoyed the ease of getting in and out of the kayaks, as well as the stability and comfort. They also appreciate that there is nowhere for spiders to hide!

2023 Reservation Requests

Our reservation team of Becky, Lucy, Zoe, and Lathrop are looking forward to welcoming you back to RDC for the 2023 season.

We will be able to serve you more efficiently if your form is filled out completely and clearly; newspapers must be ordered at least seven days prior to your arrival; golf cart rentals are available only for guests with mobility issues; weekly boat rentals may be reserved prior to your arrival; daily rentals may be requested upon your arrival.

To request a reservation, please complete the enclosed Reservation Request Form or go online to **RDCsquam.com/reservations**. Reservations are booked according to seniority. To give yourself the best opportunity to receive the cottages and dates of your choice, your request must be received before **FEBRUARY 15**.

2023 Reservation Information

RDC's 2023 season will begin Thursday, June 1, and end Friday, September 15.

The following are other adjustments and reminders for our 2023 season.

Off-Peak Season Discounts

Cottage stays of five nights or more, June 1 through June 23 and September 2 through September 14, qualify for our off-peak discount. This 20% discount applies to the cottage base rate only. Discounted rates do not apply to overages.

Change in Child Overage Calculation

New in 2023, the Child Overage Rate will now apply to children 3-9 years old. There will be no charge for children under 3 years old. The Adult Overage Rate will apply to guests age 10 years and older.

Arrival and Departure times

Arriving guests should not enter their accommodations before registering at the office. **Check-in** begins at 4 p.m. Please **check-out** by 10 a.m.

Dining

Both Rockywold and Deephaven Dining Halls will offer traditional seating with a 90-minute serving time for each meal. Please note, dining hall hours are subject to change throughout the season. Hours are posted outside each dining hall. Take-out containers will be available for those wishing to enjoy their meals outside the dining hall. Please notify Camp of any food allergies or dietary restrictions on your reservation request form and by emailing RDC@RDCsquam.com. Gluten-free, dairy-free, and vegetarian options are available at each meal.

Daily Services

We offer full daily housekeeping and outside crew services. If you prefer a lower-contact experience and would like to opt-out of any portion of these services, you may notify our office staff at any time.

Reservations in the Lodges & Rock Office Rooms

Since 2021, there has been an overwhelmingly positive response from large families who have reserved the lodges for their yearly RDC reunion. We will again offer both Greenwood Lodge and Long House, in their entirety, at a 12-person rate of \$16,640 per week during peak season. Individual rooms, with a two-night minimum, may be reserved subject to availability early and late season. See 2023 Rates for more information. Greenwood Lodge sleeps a maximum of 20 guests, and Long House sleeps a maximum of 24. Regular overage rates apply. Reservation requests for the lodges will be filled through the usual reservation process.

The Rock Office Rooms will be available for the full 2023 season. These rooms are located above the Rockywold Office and Library. Rock Office offers rooms with single, double and triple occupancy and shared bath. They can be rented individually with a two-night minimum.







2023 RATES

All cottages enjoy a private dock on Squam Lake, a fireplace, a screened-in porch, and an old-fashioned icebox. Our Full American Plan includes lodging, all meals, daily housekeeping, organized activities, and use of recreational facilities, including eight clay tennis courts, three pickleball courts, a basketball court, and a ball field. During peak season, reservations are made on a weekly basis for cottages and lodges. During off-peak season, cottages and lodge rooms may be rented for less than a week. Cottages have a three-night minimum and lodge rooms require a two-night minimum. There are no additional service charges. Gratuities are not required, but guests are welcome to reward employees for exceptional service.

OVERAGES

Most cottages accommodate guests beyond the minimal occupancy; such persons are charged the "Weekly Overage Rate" of \$1,179.50 or a "Daily Overage Rate" of \$168.50 per night. Overage Rates include three meals per day and organized activities. The Overage Rate for children ages 3-9 is 50% off the above Overage Rate. There is no overage charge for children under 3 years of age.

LODGES (June 24- September 1)

Greenwood Lodge and Long House will be rented in their entirety, by the week, during peak season. The weekly rate covers our Full American Plan charges and overages apply as described above.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Arrival and Departure times: Check-in begins at 4 p.m., and check-out is 10 a.m. To ensure your accommodation has been properly cleaned, sanitized, and inspected, arriving guests should not enter their lodging facility before registering at the office. Guests staying in the lodges or other rooms rented by the day are entitled to lunch on their day of departure. These guests must, however, check out of their room(s) before the lunch hour begins, no later than 12:30 p.m. Mid-day meals on departure and arrival days are not included in weekly rates. Bagged lunches are available to guests who give the dining hall a day's notice before departure.
- A 20% deposit, received within 30 days from the date of our offer letter, is required to confirm a reservation.
- Cancellation Policy: If a cancellation is made prior to May 15, 50% of the deposit will be refunded. Reservations canceled after May 15 and prior to a month of expected arrival will lose the full 20% deposit. Reservations canceled within one month of expected arrival will be responsible for 50% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled. Reservations canceled within two weeks of expected arrival will be responsible for 100% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled.
- New Hampshire Rooms and Meals Tax of 8.5% is added to lodging and meal charges.

- **Gratuities:** Unlike many other resorts, RDC does not add a service charge to guest bills; however, guests may wish to reward employees for exceptional service. Gratuity envelopes are available in both offices.
- There are no additional service charges.
- RDC's Recreation Programs, with activities for all ages, begins June 11 and ends September 1.
- **A morning playgroup**, called Wee Campers, is provided from June 12 to September 1 for children 3 to 6 years of age, Monday Friday, 9:30 a.m. 12 noon. (Refer to RDC's Guest Manual for details.)
- Pets cannot be accommodated except during "Dog Week", Saturday, September 9 to Friday, September 15. Sorry!
- We do not accept credit cards. Cash or check only, please!



RDC's Reservation Process:

We frequently receive multiple requests for the same accommodations in the same time periods, especially in July and August. Potential conflicts are resolved on the basis of priority and seniority (defined below).

In order to receive early consideration for an accommodation, we must receive a written request prior to **February 15**. Requests received after **February 15** will be honored but only after filling all those received before the deadline. Typically, availability becomes quite limited as the summer approaches. We ask that all guests use the Reservation Request Form on the reverse side of this paper.

When reservation bookings begin on **February 15**, the order in which reservations are placed is as follows:

- 1) All "priority" guests.
- 2) Guests with the most "seniority credit" to guests with the least seniority credit.

(Additional credit is given to guests staying for two or more consecutive weeks in the same accommodation.)

Priority:

Guests who have reserved the same accommodation during the same time period for three consecutive years earn what is called a priority. A guest having priority on a particular accommodation will be given the first option to reserve that accommodation for the appropriate time period.

Seniority Credit:

Guests receive one seniority credit for each year in which they were guests in camp for one week or longer after the age of 25. This credit applies whether or not the individual has paid an RDC bill. No credit is given for partial-week stays. An additional credit is granted to guests who stayed at RDC prior to age 25, current RDC shareholders receive one additional credit, and a further credit is granted to those guests who served as an employee for at least one full season. A maximum of one seniority credit per season is allowed for any individual.

- If the accommodation requested is available, an offer letter will be sent to you with a request for a 20% deposit. If we receive your deposit within 30 days from the date of the offer letter your reservation is confirmed.
- If the accommodation requested is not available, a staff member will attempt to contact you to discuss alternatives. Please make sure we can reach you in **February and early March** by giving us current work and home phone numbers, e-mail addresses and an alternative contact person should you be away!
- If the accommodation requested is not available, and no alternatives exist, you will be notified and put on a waiting list if you wish.

Cancellation Policy:

- If a cancellation is made prior to May 15, 50% of the deposit will be refunded.
- Reservations canceled after May 15 and prior to a month of expected arrival will lose the full 20% deposit.
- Reservations canceled within one month of expected arrival will be responsible for 50% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled.
- Reservations canceled within two weeks of expected arrival will be responsible for 100% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled.

FACILITY INFORMATION - RDC has multiple meeting/function facilities:

The Rockywold and Deephaven Dining Halls can be used for a wide variety of activities and events. Both the Rockywold and Deephaven Dining Halls can comfortably seat 250 people.

The Playhouse is a pavilion with a raised stage, suitable for entertainment, exhibits, and dances.

The Ballfield & Pavilion are available for outdoor gatherings, including field games, special picnics, and barbecues.

The Long House is a lodge situated on the Deephaven point providing spectacular views of the Squam Mountain Range and Red Hill. It has a common area that can accommodate up to 100 people theater seating, 75 people for receptions, and 60 people for banquets.

Greenwood Lodge is located on the Rockywold side of Camp and provides views of the lake and its islands. The common area can accommodate 45 people theater seating and 60 people for receptions (using porches).

Deephaven Conference Room is adjacent to the Deephaven Office. The room can accommodate 25 people in a classroom or 40 people in theater seating.

RDC's larger cottages can also be used as small meeting facilities.

Kellogg (Rec Hall) is connected to the Playhouse and located in the center of Camp. The room is equipped with a large TV, AC/heat and can accommodate up to 25 people.

The Commons is located in the center of Camp and in close proximity to the Playhouse. Within The Commons is a meeting room that opens to a large screened-in porch. It is equipped with a 75" screen TV, sound system, AC/heat and can accommodate 30-50 people.
