With guidance from the LakeSmart initiative, we are working to slow rain water and filter sediment along the way to the lake. Many of you may have seen the water run-off remediation work completed by Asa Berg and his crew on Maple Shade Road including Arthur's Way. This area is prone to significant run-off during rain storms bringing sediment into the lake and washing out the road. There is



RDC Charitable Giving

RDC continues to make a difference in the greater Holderness, NH region. In 2024, we donated \$26,000 to 23 community-based organizations ranging from environmental groups to emergency and social services. It's a welcome opportunity to give back to the local community.

In addition, RDC is putting the Squam Environmental Preservation Fund to work! By supporting our partners working to combat the effects of extreme weather, historical land use practices and ever-increasing boat pressure, we're making a difference on Squam. In 2024, we donated \$40,000 from SEPF to support loon monitoring and research, and a major erosion prevention project on Little Squam. In addition, late in the summer SEPF funded a floating vegetative island deployed by the Squam Lakes Association to pilot a plant/water nutrient absorbing project. Too many nutrients in the lake cause unwanted algal blooms. Look for this float next summer in the Deephaven Bight and a second one near the entrance to Bennett Cove in Rockywold. SEPF is run by RDC for the protection of Squam and the surrounding watershed and managed by the NH Charitable Foundation. Donations are welcome any time of the year.

Incentivized by the LakeSmart program, RDC has identified "hot spots" at camp that rapidly erode during heavy rainstorms resulting in unwanted sedimentation along the shorefront. This makes the water shallower and prone to rapid warming that create conditions suitable for algal blooms. We want to avoid this on all fronts and SEPF can help with logistics.

Building & Grounds Committee Report

During the 2025 season at Camp, we will be making an effort to consolidate parking away from the shoreline zone, and we need your help! Cyanobacteria have already been found in Lake Winnipesaukee, Lake Kanasatka, and White Oak Pond. RDC is participating in NH LAKES' "LakeSmart" program, in partnership with the Squam Lakes Association (SLA), to help preserve the water quality of Squam. Parking close to the lake compacts soils and increases surface runoff into the lake, contributing to algae growth, greener water, and loss of water clarity. Parking near the shoreline also spoils the view of the lake along many of Camp's walking routes. You can help by loading and unloading at your cottage and otherwise parking in the centralized parking lots farther from the shoreline. If you're not sure where the nearest lot is located, please consult the Camp map on the RDC website or ask for a map when you check in at the office. Thank you in advance for helping to preserve the health and beauty of Squam!

Other 2025 focuses include:

Mixed-Use Facilities (Lodges and Dining Halls)

Long House will get a new sprinkler system; improvements to the guest rooms and bathrooms; and a rebuilt porch. The dining halls will receive additional ceiling fans and lights.

Energy Efficiency and Carbon Reduction

Again in 2025, a portion of the capital budget will fund projects supporting RDC's "2047 Initiative" to minimize energy usage, fossil fuels consumption, and carbon emissions by Camp's 150th anniversary in 2047. RDC will continue to pursue grants to assist with this work. An external energy audit was performed on the dining halls and the year-round office, and a camp-wide inventory of carbon emissions is beginning.

Information technology systems will be upgraded this year, including computers, server, software, and security. RDC is continuing to work hard toward connectivity improvements, for the benefit of guests and staff alike. A number of roofs are slated for replacement in 2025, along with general building maintenance projects.

2024 Loon Report

Some of you may have had your picnic plans on Loon Island disrupted this summer, courtesy of two loon nesting attempts there! This loon territory is the neighboring territory to that of the RDC pair; but the male at Loon Island had actually moved over from the RDC territory, where he had been the resident male for the previous four years. These nesting attempts were momentous occasions, as they were the first in the 50 years that Loon Preservation Committee (LPC) has been working that we have documented nests for a pair in this territory. Sadly, predators destroyed both nests after about a week. Hopefully the pair will choose a different spot next summer that is better protected

Closer to home, both members of the RDC pair were new this year. While the male had gone to the Loon Island territory, the female was nowhere to be found on the lake. As many of you may remember, the resident female at RDC for so many years was the oldest banded loon on the lake. Last summer when she raised her chick amid so much excitement, she was at least 31 years old. I did not see her anywhere on the lake this year, but I will continue to keep an eye out for her next year and hope for the best for her. As it was, there were two unbanded loons in the RDC territory this year, who spent much of the summer trying to hang on to their territory, despite the intrusions of other loons.

I hope they will gain firmer control over the territory next year and be able to nest.

Across the lake, there were encouraging signs for Squam's loon population. While only seven of the 14 loon pairs on the lake nested this year (likely due to a high rate of turnover among the pairs, in common with the RDC pair), those seven nesting pairs hatched seven chicks—an excellent hatch rate. Four of those chicks fledged in the fall. The past five years have seen a welcome boost in the hatch rate, and this year added to that encouraging trend. Hopefully a return to more nesting pairs in the next year or two and continued good hatch rates will lead to a boost in overall breeding success.

LPC has been working hard to increase the breeding success of Squam's loons. We floated nine nesting rafts on the lake in 2024, and all seven chicks hatched from LPC's rafts—only the third year that has happened! We placed protective signs and ropes around loon nests, and chicks were protected by LPC's orange "Caution: Loon Chicks" signs. In addition to the four fledged chicks on Squam Lake, the loon pair on Little Squam successfully raised a chick as well.

I hope the RDC loon pair will settle down to nesting next year—and that the old RDC female loon is still alive and will return to Squam. LPC will continue our work to protect and restore Squam's loon population. We are very grateful to the RDC community and the Squam Environmental Preservation Fund for your support of Squam's loons and the work of LPC—Thank You!

2024 Bald Eagle Report



The Squam Lake Bald Eagle pair used the same nest as last year on Long Island. They started incubating eggs during the last week of March, but by early April they had given up. I assume that the super heavy snow storm on April 5 caused them to fail. They did not attempt to rebuild and did not breed this season. The early spring snow seemed to cause a lot of nest failures throughout the state. The following is an excerpt from the statewide eagle report from NH Audubon's Chris Martin:

"NH Audubon staff and volunteers confirmed **115 territorial pairs** in NH, up 5% compared to 2023. We documented **79 pairs incubating**, up just less than 4% from 2023. But we counted only **54 successful nests**, down more than 11% from 2023. And we tallied just **80 young fledged**, off 14% from the record-high 93 fledglings produced in 2023. While eagles generally incubate diligently through

storms, there are limits! Snow accumulating >18 inches can settle in around eggs during incubation exchanges between the adults and chill/kill embryos. The 2024 average young per active nest (0.70y/active) was the lowest annual average for NH eagles in over 20 years, and the last time this average was lower we only had five known active eagle nests in the entire state!"

The exciting news for our area is that a second pair of eagles built a nest on Little Squam. This is the first time that two pairs have nested within the watershed. This new pair chose a lovely spot in a protected forest area. They got a late start (I didn't locate them building until April 1). They built a lovely big nest but did not lay eggs (it just got too late in the nesting season). This is typical of a new (young) pair, but I expect them to lay eggs in 2025. Hopefully both pairs will be successful and produce chicks next season.

Dining Hall Etiquette

The RDC dining halls are an integral part of the overall Camp experience. In the spirit of this, we would like to remind you of some important dining hall guidelines. While the dining hall dress code has become more relaxed over the last several decades, RDC is proud of its time-honored custom of dressing for dinner. For many guests, this is an important and traditional aspect of their RDC experience. We would like to remind all of our guests of the RDC dress code and request that you follow these simple guidelines while inside the dining hall. Young children should be supervised at all times by an adult. Children should refrain from running for the safety of all. To help maintain the sense of community and camaraderie while at meals, we would also like to remind you to please not use cell phones or laptops while in the Camp dining halls. Please see below for guidance on dinner attire.

Dress code: No caps, tank tops, bathing suits or bare feet at any meal. Casual sportswear is acceptable for breakfast and lunch but more appropriate dress is recommended for dinner (non-athletic shorts, pants, collared shirt for men; dresses, skirts, pants, non-athletic shorts for women).

We will be able to serve you more efficiently if your form is filled out completely and clearly; newspapers must be ordered at least seven days prior to your arrival; golf cart rentals are available only for guests with mobility issues; weekly boat rentals may be reserved prior to your arrival; daily rentals may be requested upon your arrival.

To request a reservation, please complete the enclosed Reservation Request Form or go online to RDCsquam.com/reservations. Reservations are booked according to seniority. To give yourself the best opportunity to receive the cottages and dates of your choice, your request must be received before **FEBRUARY 15**.

2025 Reservation Information

RDC's 2025 season will begin Thursday, May 29, and end Friday, September 12.

Off-Peak Season Discounts

Cottage stays of five nights or more, May 29 through June 20 and August 30 through September 12, qualify for our off-peak discount. This 20% discount applies to the cottage base rate only. Discounted rates do not apply to lodge rooms or overages.

Arrival and Departure Times

Arriving guests should not enter their accommodations before registering at the office. Check-in begins at 4 p.m. Please check-out by 10 a.m.

Dining

Both Rockywold and Deephaven dining halls will offer traditional seating with a 90-minute serving time for each meal. Please note dining hall hours are subject to

change throughout the season. Hours are posted outside each dining hall. Mid-day meals on departure and arrival days are not included in weekly rates. Bagged lunches are available to guests who give the dining hall a day's notice before departure.

Please notify Camp of any food allergies or dietary restrictions on your reservation request form and by emailing RDC@RDCsquam.com. Gluten free, dairy free, and vegetarian options are available at each meal.

Daily Services

We offer full daily housekeeping and outside crew services. If you prefer a lower-contact experience and would like to opt-out of any portion of these services, you may notify our office staff at any time.

Reservations in the Lodges & Rock Office Rooms

Within our two lodge facilities, Greenwood Lodge and Long House, guests can rent double and single bedrooms for short-term or weeklong stays. Each lodge has a large common area with a fireplace and a spacious porch overlooking the lake.

These rooms offer more affordable and flexible options for guests, they have been valuable places to welcome newcomers, and importantly, they facilitate the stays of those who need more accessible accommodations. Several double occupancy rooms have private

half baths. Reservations in the lodges are subject to a two-night minimum stay, and the usual seniority and priority guidelines apply. The lodges are available to guests 13 years of age and older. Lodge guests are seated at a community table in the dining hall unless otherwise requested.

The Rock Office Rooms are available for guests of all ages. These rooms are located above the Rockywold Office and Library. Rock Office offers rooms with single, double and triple occupancy and shared bath. They can be rented individually with a twonight minimum stay.

Guests staying in the lodges or other rooms rented by the day are entitled to lunch on their day of departure. These guests must, however, check out of their room(s) before the lunch hour begins, no later than 12:30 p.m.





2025 RATES

All cottages enjoy a private dock on Squam Lake, a fireplace, a screened-in porch, and an old-fashioned icebox. Our Full American Plan includes lodging, all meals, daily housekeeping, organized activities, and use of recreational facilities, including eight clay tennis courts, three pickleball courts, a basketball court, and a ball field. During peak season, reservations are made on a weekly basis for cottages. Cottages may be rented for less than a week during off-peak season, subject to a three-night minimum stay. Lodge rooms require a two-night minimum stay throughout the full season. There are no additional service charges. Gratuities are not required, but guests are welcome to reward employees for exceptional service.

OVERAGES

Most cottages accommodate guests beyond the minimal occupancy; such persons are charged the "Weekly Overage Rate" of \$1,275.75 or a "Daily Overage Rate" of \$182.25 per night. Overage Rates include three meals per day and organized activities. The Overage Rate for children ages 3-9 is 50% off the above Overage Rate. There is no overage charge for children under 3 years of age.

LODGE & ROCK OFFICE ROOM RATES

The daily rate covers our Full American Plan charges and overages apply as described above. Reservations in the lodges and Rock Office rooms are subject to a two-night minimum stay. (Discounted rate periods apply to cottages only.)

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Arrival and Departure times: Check-in begins at 4 p.m., and check-out is 10 a.m. To ensure your accommodation has been properly cleaned, sanitized, and inspected, arriving guests should not enter their lodging facility before registering at the office.
 Mid-day meals on departure and arrival days are not included in weekly rates. Bagged lunches are available to guests who give the dining hall a day's notice before departure.
- A 20% deposit, received within 30 days from the date of our offer letter, is required to confirm a reservation.
- Cancellation Policy: If a cancellation is made prior to May 15, 50% of the deposit will be refunded. Reservations canceled after May 15 and prior to a month of expected arrival will lose the full 20% deposit. Reservations canceled within one month of expected arrival will be responsible for 50% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled. Reservations canceled within two weeks of expected arrival will be responsible for 100% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled.
- New Hampshire Rooms and Meals Tax of 8.5% is added to lodging and meal charges.
- **Gratuities:** Unlike many other resorts, RDC does not add a service charge to guest bills; however, guests may wish to reward employees for exceptional service. Gratuity envelopes are available in both offices.
- There are no additional service charges.
- RDC's Recreation Programs, with activities for all ages, begins June 8 and ends August 29.
- A morning playgroup, called Wee Campers, is provided from June 9 to August 29 for children 3 to 6 years of age, Monday Friday, 9:30 a.m. 12 noon. (Refer to RDC's Guest Manual for details.)
- Pets cannot be accommodated except during "Dog Week", Saturday, September 6 to Friday, September 12. Sorry!
- We do not accept credit cards. Cash or check only, please!

Boat House Update

RDC partnered with Design Assembly for a second project in June 2024, after building the compostable privy on Loon Island in 2023. This year the architecture students, led by architect (and RDC Board Member) John McLeod built a boat shed at the Boat House to store 20 pedal kayaks. The new shed provides off-season storage for the pedal kayaks and is a handy workspace in the summer, when all the kayaks are in the water.

Next year we will have 30 of the very popular Malibu pedal kayaks, a sit-on-top kayak with an efficient pedal drive system and hand-controlled rudder steering. We are also continuing to upgrade older Old Town Dirigo tandem kayaks with the Malibu II double sit-on-top kayak. The newer kayaks are easy to get in and out of at a dock, have a comfortable seat, and are very stable.

Have you been wanting to try your hand at sailing on Squam? Did you know that the Sunfish is the most popular recreational sailboat in history? Its classic design, unmatched stability and sailing ease are enjoyed by all ages. RDC has a fleet of Sunfish that can be rented by the day or week. Compete in our weekly Sunfish Regatta, held on Wednesday or Friday afternoons at 3 p.m. (depending on weather) and race from Flagstaff Point, around Otter and Birch Islands, around Deephaven Reef and back to the race committee boat.

Guests often ask what the difference is between an aluminum canoe and a plastic canoe. Here is the answer! Aluminum canoes are solid canoes that were built to last for generations. They provide good stability and tracking for families or Wacky Canoe Races. Plastic canoes are the ideal family canoe with a wide, flat bottom that provides reassuring stability. These canoes are aesthetically appealing and fun to paddle for the whole family.



RDC's Reservation Process:

We frequently receive multiple requests for the same accommodations in the same time periods, especially in July and August. Potential conflicts are resolved on the basis of priority and seniority (defined below).

In order to receive early consideration for an accommodation, we must receive a written request prior to **February 15**. Requests received after **February 15** will be honored but only after filling all those received before the deadline. Typically, availability becomes quite limited as the summer approaches. We ask that all guests use the Reservation Request Form on the reverse side of this paper.

When reservation bookings begin on February 15, the order in which reservations are placed is as follows:

- 1) All "priority" guests.
- 2) Guests with the most "seniority credit" to guests with the least seniority credit.

(Additional credit is given to guests staying for two or more consecutive weeks in the same accommodation.)

Priority:

Guests who have reserved the same accommodation during the same time period for three consecutive years earn what is called a priority. A guest having priority on a particular accommodation will be given the first option to reserve that accommodation for the appropriate time period.

Seniority Credit:

Guests receive one seniority credit for each year in which they were guests in camp for one week or longer after the age of 25. This credit applies whether or not the individual has paid an RDC bill. No credit is given for partial-week stays. An additional credit is granted to guests who stayed at RDC prior to age 25, current RDC shareholders receive one additional credit, and a further credit is granted to those guests who served as an employee for at least one full season. A maximum of one seniority credit per season is allowed for any individual.

- If the accommodation requested is available, an offer letter will be sent to you with a request for a 20% deposit. If we receive your deposit within 30 days from the date of the offer letter your reservation is confirmed.
- If the accommodation requested is not available, a staff member will attempt to contact you to discuss alternatives. Please make sure we can reach you in **February and early March** by giving us current work and home phone numbers, e-mail addresses and an alternative contact person should you be away!
- If the accommodation requested is not available, and no alternatives exist, you will be notified and put on a waiting list if you wish.

Cancellation Policy:

- If a cancellation is made prior to May 15, 50% of the deposit will be refunded.
- Reservations canceled after May 15 and prior to a month of expected arrival will lose the full 20% deposit.
- Reservations canceled within one month of expected arrival will be responsible for 50% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled.
- Reservations canceled within two weeks of expected arrival will be responsible for 100% of the total bill if the resulting vacancy is not filled.

- To qualify for conference rates, your group must have a minimum of 25 overnight stays per night.
- The conference leader will be responsible for payment to RDC of all overnight accommodations and other associated fees.

FACILITY INFORMATION - RDC has multiple meeting/function facilities:

The Rockywold and Deephaven Dining Halls can be used for a wide variety of activities and events. Both the Rockywold and Deephaven Dining Halls can comfortably seat 250 people.

The Playhouse is a pavilion with a raised stage, suitable for entertainment, exhibits, and dances.

The Ball Field & Pavilion are available for outdoor gatherings, including field games, special picnics, and barbecues.

The Long House is a lodge situated on the Deephaven point providing spectacular views of the Squam Mountain Range and Red Hill. It has a common area that can accommodate up to 100 people theater seating, 75 people for receptions, and 60 people for banquets.

Greenwood Lodge is located on the Rockywold side of Camp and provides views of the lake and its islands. The common area can accommodate 45 people theater seating and 60 people for receptions (using porches).

Deephaven Conference Room is adjacent to the Deephaven Office. The room can accommodate 25 people in a classroom or 40 people in theater seating.

RDC's larger cottages can also be used as small meeting facilities.

Kellogg (Rec Hall) is connected to the Playhouse and located in the center of Camp. The room is equipped with a large TV, AC/heat and can accommodate up to 25 people.

The Commons is located in the center of Camp and in close proximity to the Playhouse. Within The Commons is a meeting room that opens to a large screened-in porch. It is equipped with a 75" screen TV, sound system, AC/heat and can accommodate 30-50 people.
